Dual-Wheel Tile Cutter

<u>Need by 1<sup>st</sup> session (all are included in the materials fee):</u>	<u>Cost Estimate</u>
• Design inspiration photos (optional, but extremely helpful). These can be anything that inspires you to want to make art from it, sparks your imagination, or goes with your decor.	Priceless
• Design Materials such as: sketch book, colored pencils, crayons, markers, drawing pencils, eraser (pick and choose whatever you're comfortable with)	\$5
• Vitreous glass tile—available locally at Full Spectrum, Michaels, Meiningers, Hobby Lobby, or online at various sources.	\$6-8
• Stained glass-- available locally at Full Spectrum, Stained Glass Connection/Royalty Stained Glass and Hobby Lobby	\$3-15
• Found glass, frosted glass, glass gems, any other types of glass NOTE: Please be sure to purchase a wide enough color palette to work your design.	vary
• Dual Wheel Tile Cutter, available at Full Spectrum, Royalty Art Glass or Meiningers.	\$24-36
• Wooden base approx. 12" square: ¼" hardboard from Home Depot or Lowe's NOTE: If you're using plywood you will need to seal it WELL with wood primer.	\$4-8
• Glues: choose the glue that says it works with your mosaic materials—you'll need to read the labels. Your choices are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Craft Glues: most are available at craft stores</li><li>○ Crafter's Pick, Tacky Glue, or any other thick water-soluble glue</li><li>○ WeldBond (optional)</li></ul>	\$2-5
• Safety glasses (optional)	vary

Needed by 2<sup>nd</sup> session, all of the above (all are included in the materials fee):

Needed by 3<sup>rd</sup> session (again, these are covered by the materials fee):

• Craft sticks (thin tongue depressor) to stir the grout with	\$1
• Disposable plastic cups or containers to mix the grout in	\$1
• Vinyl or rubber gloves	\$1
• Grout—sanded, not premixed. I recommend sanded grout in this class because it is easier to work with than unsanded or premixed grouts. This can be purchased at Full Spectrum, Hobby Lobby or Michaels or at hardware stores in the tile aisle.	\$5-13
• Hanging hardware and picture wire	\$4-8
