"Put on a Happy Face" at the Fine Arts Center's next mainstage production, Bye Bye Birdie!

COLORADO SPRINGS (*Feb. 27, 2017*) — The Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center (FAC) is excited to present *Bye Bye Birdie*, the first rock 'n' roll musical, to the FAC mainstage March 30-April 23. Directed and choreographed by Nathan Halvorson, *Bye Bye Birdie* remains as fresh and vibrant as ever.

This modern classic takes the stage in an all-new production. It's the late 1950's and teenagers from across the United States are going crazy for handsome rock star, Conrad Birdie. Disaster strikes when Conrad receives a draft notice to join the military. His manager stages a publicity stunt for Conrad to kiss one lucky fan on The Ed Sullivan Show before he leaves for the army. Conrad Birdie gets more than he bargained for when he arrives in Sweet Apple, which is reeling with excitement for his visit. Songs like *An English Teacher, What Did I Ever See in Him?*, *Put on a Happy Face, One Boy, A Lot of Livin' to Do, Kids, Rosie* and *Spanish Rose* are musical theatre classics. No wonder *Birdie* won four Tony Awards and remains one of the most captivating shows of our time.

Fine Arts Center

In 1919 the Broadmoor Art Academy (BAA) was established in the former home of philanthropists Julie and Spencer Penrose. After the Great Depression hit in 1929, the BAA looked at diversifying further, expanding into an entire arts district under one roof. And that's how the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center (FAC) came to be. The FAC, built in 1936, is a privately funded, non-profit art museum, professional theatre company and arts education center. Built on the foundation of the prestigious BAA, the FAC carries the legacy of Colorado's arts and cultural heritage. One of 16 charter members of the American Alliance of Museums, the FAC offers the best in visual arts via its permanent collection and travelling exhibitions, as a TCG member theatre company, and through arts education with the FAC's Bemis School of Art. The FAC building is considered an architectural treasure in the Rocky Mountain region, designed by John Gaw Meem, and is listed on the National Register of Historical Places.
